HOW TO CHOOSE THE BEST LAWYER FOR YOUR CASE

Thether it's for a criminal case, **V** family law, or a personal injury case, it can be an intimidating task to hire a lawyer. However, there are actually many tools available to help you choose an attorney who will be a good fit for you and your case.

Get a personal referral. Ask around your circle of friends and family, have they had experience with an attorney and was it good or bad? Sometimes the nature of your case is personal and you may not want to discuss the details with people you know. That's where searching online can be useful. Online sites like AVVO will have a synopsis of the lawyer's practice, case results, years of experience and if they've ever been disciplined by the Bar Association. When in doubt, you can always ask Google, "who is the best (type of case) lawyer in (your town/state)?" You shouldn't base your nity? decision on any single one of these items,

but they can be used to piece together a picture of your potential attorney.

Once you have a couple of attorneys in mind, you should take a few minutes to review their websites. A good website will have a comprehensive biography of back up the firm's experience and success. The website should have testimonials from former clients.
